Rear-facing Car Seats

Infant Car Seat

- Five-point harness
- Comes with carrier and a base that stays in the car
- Seat should be 45° angle for newborn, unless otherwise stated.



Convertible Car Seat – 1st Stage

- Five-point harness
- Turns into a front-facing car seat



Front-facing Car Seats

Convertible Car Seat – 2nd Stage

- Five-point harness
- Used when your child outgrows the seat's rear-facing configuration

Combination Car Seat – 1st stage

- Five-point harness
- Turns into a high back booster seat



Combination Car Seat – 2nd Stage

- Sturdy backrest to cushion spine
- Repositions car seatbelt to properly secure a small child
- Used when your child outgrows the seat's five-point harness configuration



Booster Seats

High Back Booster

- Sturdy backrest to cushion spine
- Repositions car seatbelt to properly secure a small child



Backless Booster

- No backrest
- Repositions car seatbelt to properly secure a small child
