- Flexible

The St. John Ambulance Instructor Development program is an excellent one. You must apply to be accepted into it. A St. John Ambulance Standard First Aid + CPR level HCP certificate in current standing is required as a pre-requisite. The Instructor course is 40 hours long and runs over 5 days or 2 weekends (2 Friday evenings, 2 Saturdays and 2 Sundays). Courses are offered throughout the year at various St. John Ambulance branches throughout Ontario.
